Riverview, New Brunswick —TransAqua and the governments of Canada and New Brunswick are pleased to announce that the construction and commissioning of the Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrade and Modernization Project is complete.

TransAqua met the federal effluent regulations by the end of December 2020 and completed the \$90.4 million Upgrade Project under budget (\$88,808,746). The governments of Canada and New Brunswick each contributed over \$22 million to this project.
